## **Mission Mexico**

Last March 12 of us spent our whole spring break on a mission trip to Mexico. It was a fantastic experience! We worked at an orphanage in Acapulco. In the mornings we prepared the new boys' bathroom for painting, and we spent the afternoons with the children. Some of the team taught a Bible lesson, some organized crafts, and others played sports. We ate dinner with the children and led the evening devotions before bedtime. They were charm-

ing and very glad to see us. One day we participated in the new ministry to street children – kids who live on the streets, most of whom are addicted to drugs. It was wonderful to be part of a mission which shows the love of Christ by caring for orphans.

## **Summer RUF**

Last year we had our first summer RUF. Attendance varied from 6 to 16. This summer we had over 20 every week! The group was too large for a normal Bible study, so we split up into 3 to 5 smaller groups. I opened with some introductory remarks, then several students led the small groups using questions I had prepared. That got everyone involved and gave others a chance to try leading a group. I sat in and later gave suggestions to the leaders for improving their leadership. At the end we reconvened and I drew conclusions. We spent the summer studying Nehemiah, where we saw God's faithfulness to His people in helping them rebuild the wall of Jerusalem. It also prompted many spin-off discussions!

## **Explosive Growth**

The summer Bible study launched us into a fantastic fall ministry. Several other students joined the Ministry Team in reaching freshmen, and within a few weeks we had 70 new contacts! The students are catching on to energetically pursuing people who express interest in our ministry. Our large group meeting has swelled with many new members and the Bible studies are reaching several dozen more. It's especially exciting that most of these new members are being invited by students. Following are some snapshots of the growth this semester.

**Internationals.** We have been blessed with 8 Chinese students, most from Hong Kong and south China. Last month three were baptized. They are soaking up the Christian fellowship here, and keep inviting their friends. We also have students from Malaysia, Sri Lanka, the Philippines, Puerto Rico, and Viet Nam! The Vietnamese student is an unbeliever who has joined a Bible study and attended the fall conference because he wants to learn about Christianity. A handful of 2nd generation Indians round out the ethnic mix in our group.

**Conferences.** Conference attendance has been a weak spot in our ministry. This year the Ministry Team decided to return to New England, even though the New England RUF conference moved to New Hampshire. I doubted that we would find many people willing to make

the 11 hour trip, but 20 went! It was a long ride, but everyone enjoyed the weekend. The messages on spiritual transformation were excellent, and the interaction with RUF students from Harvard, Brown, and Yale was good.

The following month we went to Lancaster for a short weekend training conference. The original purpose was to train future Bible study leaders, but we have such committed freshmen, they wanted to come, too. Steven Badorf, the campus minister at Towson University in Maryland, led a track for freshmen and I led the track for Bible study leaders. It was intense, but invigorating. They want to do it again next semester!

## Bible Studies

---

Last year I led all but one of our Bible studies. We were at a place where we needed to reach freshmen in the dorms, but only two students were ready to help. Perhaps the Bible studies are the biggest news this year. Rick Noecker, Seamas Whitesel, and John Bright are leading some of the best Bible studies I've seen. Seamas and John have several assistant leaders who are shouldering a major part of the load. To put things into perspective, each of these Bible studies is reaching as many people as this whole ministry three years ago!
